Materials Permitted

AGRICULTURAL materials that originate from the property which consist of dry/dead, cut down and piled agricultural vegetation only.

Materials Prohibited

- Furniture, mattresses or other finished goods
- Household waste
- Old buildings, sheds, fences, etc.
- Plastics, tires, insulation
- Construction material and pallets

DO NOT BURN if the Provincial Burning Ban is in effect from June 1st to September 30th.

DO NOT BURN if a Regional or Provincial ban is in effect.

DO NOT BURN unless you have a valid City of Port Coquitlam Burning Permit.

Permit Application Information

ALL applications shall be made at the **Tax Department** at City Hall – 2580 Shaughnessy Street.

- An application must be submitted in advance of the desired burn date.
- Open Air Burning Permits are only valid for the property they are issued for and are nontransferable.
- Open Air Burning Permits must be kept on site and accessible to the Fire Department personnel while burning is taking place.

ALL open air burning requires a permit.

Burning Permits will only be issued from October 1st until May 31st.

No burning is permitted during the Provincial Burning Ban from June 1st to September 30th.

Burning Instructions

- ALL material should be dead, cut and dry before burning.
- Make the pile wide and long rather than high. This will spread the heat and be safer. Burn piles must be constructed as per materials permitted.
- Stay away from fences and property boundaries. Maintain a clear area between piles and any other combustible material.
- Choose a space with an open canopy away from the base of trees. Avoid piling vegetation close to neighbouring properties.
- Live power lines require a wide berth. Consider the radiant heat and smoke the burn will generate.
- Special equipment may be required to manage and extinguish the fire safely.



Open Air Burning is **NOT PERMITTED** in urban areas at any time of year.

To report any burning complaint, please call 9-1-1

Backyard fire pits, bonfires, outdoor fireplaces, recreational fires and camp fires are **NOT PERMITTED** in any area at any time of the year.

Outdoor cooking is permitted in approved barbecues or grills using propane, natural gas or charcoal.
